St Anne's College DIY Tour

Welcome to St Anne's! We sit comfortably between Banbury Road, next to the University Science Park, and the Woodstock Road. We are an eclectic mix of buildings, from late 19c houses to the modern Ruth Deech Building.

Eleanor Plumer House (EPH, also known as the MCR)

This building contains the MCR common room, grad student accommodation, a work room with computing and printing facilities, notice boards, pigeon holes, bathroom and shower facilities. It is a great place to relax, meet friends and find out more about what's going on, watch TV or play games, check your email (wifithroughout), catch up with the newspapers or read the magazines. There's also a kitchen, with free tea, coffee, milk and biscuits.

Ruth Deech Building (RDB)

Home to the vitally important **Porters' Lodge** and reception for all visitors. It has undergrad bedrooms as well as seminar/teaching space, the multimedia **Tsuzuki Lecture Theatre**, and ample social areas for events like **Wine Tasting**. It's named after the previous Principal of St Anne's, Baroness Ruth Deech. Her portrait hangs in the foyer.

Hartland House

Hartland House is where you will find the **College Library** – the largest college library in Oxford with 110,000+ volumes. You read *a lot* here! In term time, it's *the place* that never sleeps – now with 24-hour opening.

At the opposite end of Hartland House on the ground floor you will find the **Treasury** where all financial matters are dealt with. Treasury staff are always happy to meet with students to discuss any matter with them.

Half way along the ground floor corridor you will find the **Junior Common Room** (**JCR**) – the **Hartland Room**. This is where the undergrads hang out.

The first floor of Hartland House (above the Treasury) is where you will find the **Principal's Office** and the **Academic Office**. The Academic Office handles all aspects of a student's 'academic career': from the pre-application stage (Open Days), admissions, enrolment, examinations, all aspects of academic administration within college and with other parts of the University, and graduation.

Trenaman House

Trenaman House contains undergrad student bedrooms as well as our new coffee shop STACS – St Anne's Coffee Shop. STACS is open from 9.30am-6.30pm, seven days a week during term time (Weeks 0-9), and serves excellent coffees, muffins, paninis etc. in comfortable surroundings. It's a great place to relax or study with seating upstairs, TV and wifi access.

Mary Ogilvie Lecture Theatre (MOLT)

The MOLT is attached to the **Claire Palley** residential building and is a venue for **Subject Family Events** and other lectures, plus film screenings and music recitals, as well as art exhibitions in the foyer.

The Dining Hall is where everyone meets up to chat over meals, a welcome distraction from academic work. Of course, it serves the best food in Oxford and our Formal Halls are brilliant and unstuffy. College Fellows take their meals at High Table. The Upper Common Room is used for special events, including MCR Dinners.

Wolfson and Rayne Buildings. These overlook the main quad and are usually undergrad residences.

College Bar. This is a very popular venue. Drinks are cheap, there's a pool table, table-football, quiz machine, dart board and juke box.

The Gatehouse. This consists of 20 undergrad bedrooms. Here you will find the JCR post room and top up card machine for the washing machines and dryers. Check with the Lodge if you are unsure how to put credit on your card.

Woodstock Road/Bevington Road (houses numbered 58/60 Woodstock and 1 to 10 Bevington Road).

These are Victorian houses, home to many undergrads, particularly in their first year. The **Laundry** is located in the basement of 58/60 Woodstock, guaranteed to get your clothes squeaky clean. There's a small **Gym Room** with exercise bikes and a weights room downstairs in 58 Woodstock Road. Rowing machines are available in the **Erg Room** located in Room 2 of 6 Bevington Road. There's also an **Art Room** that is stocked with a wide range of art materials in Room 7 of 7 Bevington Road. To gain access to these rooms ask the Lodge.

Teaching Rooms

Most of these are in the Victorian houses – 48 and 50 Woodstock Road, and 27, 29, 39, 41 Banbury Road. The MCR also runs the **Sciences** and **Arts & Humanities Discussion Group Series** in these rooms, usually in 48 Woodstock.

Like all colleges, we share sporting facilities a short distance from the College. Whether you have Olympic aspirations and talent, or just want to let off steam or have a go at something new, get involved.

St Anne's doesn't have a chapel or cloisters, or deer grazing the grass by a babbling brook. But we are very proud of our **informal** and beautifully maintained grounds.
